Title: Institutional strengthening of Latvian environmental administration for implementation and enforcement of Community environmental legislation

#### 1. Location

#### 2. Objectives

#### **General objective:**

To assist the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Regional Development, MEPRD, (including subordinated and regional institutions) in implementation and enforcement of the Community environmental legislation, especially, in water, air, waste and industrial pollution sectors.

#### Specific objectives

Strengthening of regional environmental institutions with a view to assisting Latvia in its efforts to develop approximation and implementation strategies.

- ◆ To assist MEPRD in the process of restructuring of environmental institutions according to the Latvian Approximation Strategy and Action Programme.
- ◆ To organise and conduct training programmes for representatives of the Latvian environmental institutions, especially inspectorates.
- ♦ To provide assistance to environmental institutions, and inspectorates, in the selection and issuing of informative materials on Community legislation in order to create a more general awareness of the specific requirements.
- ♦ To provide additional assistance to the local and regional authorities in implementation of the Community Water Framework Directive in the nearest future.
- ♦ To provide Latvian regional environmental laboratories with sampling and analytical equipment for testing of the most common parameters of water, soil, air as well as emissions according to standards.
- ◆ To address the hazardous waste issues as described in the National Programme for Integration into the EU, namely management, movement, handling and disposal, all to Community standards.

#### **National Programme for European Integration**

To recognise, develop and strengthen Latvian environmental institutions to implement and enforce Community legislative requirements

• structural optimisation and distribution of functions of environmental institutions.

(1999 - 2001)

♦ strengthening of the environmental monitoring network (1998-2005)
The institutional strengthening issues are included also in all other environmental priorities of the National Programme.

#### **Accsession Partnership**

<u>Short Term</u> - institutional strengthening in the area of environment. <u>Medium Term</u> - development of monitoring and implementation control structures and capacities.

#### 3. Description

#### 1) Description

This project is divided into three "sub-projects" or "components" which, combined, will assist the MEPRD in their efforts to develop approximation and implementation strategies for the environmental sector in Latvia. Whereas the overall project includes both an element of investment and Technical Assistance they are, by necessity, closely linked as each is dependent on the other.

#### 2) Project components and inputs

The proposed project will consist of 3 components:

#### **Component 1.** Strengthening of environmental institutions.

#### ♦ Institutional Strengthening

Assistance will be provided for assistance in restructuring of the environmental institutions and in strengthening of regional inspectorates. Based on the Latvian EU Approximation Strategy and Action Programme this project will develop approximation and implementation strategies at regional level to ensure that all Regional Environmental Boards (REBs) will be able to implement Community legislative requirements.

### ♦ Training programmes

At present most of local administrators, specialists and environmental inspectors have inadequate knowledge and skills for the implementation of Community legislation. This component will include preparation of special training programs, courses, workshops, seminars for environmental inspectors and other specialists of local and regional level

#### ♦ Information issues

This component will provide printed information materials such as manuals and directives etc. on Community legislation issues and technical guidelines for pollution control in different industries to the Regional Environmental Boards and municipalities. This is considered of much importance since it is necessary to make the REBs more aware of the Community requirements in he environmental sector. The REBs will receive adequate hardware, software, networking, fax and E-mail capabilities.

♦ Implementation of EU Water Framework Directive

This component will include study to define the needs of Latvian regional authorities for implementation of the proposed Community Water Framework Directive, including analysis of the existing capacity of the institutions, restructuring need and preparation of Action Plan.

# <u>Component 2</u>. Provision of Latvian regional environmental laboratories with sampling and analytical equipment.

The project activities includes:

- purchase and supply of water, soil, air sampling and sample pre-treatment equipment and advanced analytical equipment for regional environmental laboratories.
- short-term training of the laboratory staff in use of Community standard methods and new analytical equipment.

## **Component 3.** Assistance in the development of systems for dealing with Hazardous Waste.

This component includes provision of technical assistance to the MEPRD in relation to the development of systems to deal with hazardous waste issues. Specifically this will include the following

- ◆ TA to assist with the development of the necessary institutions to handle Hazardous waste problems
- Review and recommend on the monitoring requirements for the movement of hazardous waste substances in relation to Community rules on classification, packaging and registration, trade and import/export limitations, risk assessment procedures and chemical testing.

#### **Expected results and outputs**

- ♦ Establishment of Community legislation approximation and implementation programmes in Regional Environmental Boards and Inspectorates;
- ◆ Training of environmental officials at regional level on implementation of Community legislation;
- Preparation and distribution of guidance documents for environmental inspectors;
- ♦ Completion of an action plan for implementation of Community Water Framework directive at the regional level;
- ♦ Supply of Hardware, Software, Networking, Fax and E-mail capabilities to Regional Environmental Boards, Government subordinate institutions stc.
- Reports and recommendation on current Latvia legislation on the movement of hazardous waste substances within the country and between Latvia and other countries.
- ♦ Reports and recommendation on current Latvian legislation on hazardous waste permitting.
- ♦ Investigations, inventories and development of management systems for different categories of hazardous waste;
- provision of laboratory equipment for regional Environmental Boards;
- short term training of laboratory specialists;

#### 4. Institutional Framework

To implement Community environmental legislation in such sectors as water, air and waste, the existing institutions of licencing and enforcement - Regional Environmental Boards (REBs) should be significantly strengthened. Together with these other subordinate institutions and sectors within the MEPRD require technical assistance in order to more capably implement Government policy.

In view of the above, it was considered practical to divide the project into three sub-projects as described below.

Component 1 of this project relates to the provision of support for the institutional development of environmental institutions in order to assist in implementation of Community environmental legislation in water, air and waste sectors, particularly, in licensing and enforcement. Specifically it will involve support to institutions subordinated to the MEPRD e.g. Regional Environmental Protection Boards, several subordinated institutions (Environmental Data Centre, EIA Board, Environmental Consulting and Monitoring Centre) and some functions, which presently are carried out by the Ministry (project management, running databases, etc.).

With regards to the above a specific need has been identified in relation to the strengthening of the laboratory system of the Ministry. *Component 2* of this project will therefore complement and contribute to implementation of the Latvian environmental monitoring development strategy.

Component 3 is again closely related to the previously described components since Latvia should adopt legislation relating to the management of hazardous waste. This includes aspects such as movement, handling and disposal of hazardous waste materials as discussed in the National Programme for Integration into the EU. Whereas some structures have already been put into place, much work remains to be effected on the legal and institutional side. This will largely involve Technical Assistance to the MEPRD.

Relation of project with previous Phare activities and with ongoing project financed from other sources (national, bilateral or multilateral funding)

Phare DISAE Facility project LAT - 103 *Development of the approximation strategy and programme* will end in June 1998. The objective of the project is to provide institutional capacity to the Latvian Ministry of Environmental Protection and Regional Development for development of the Latvian Approximation Strategy and Action Programme.

Phare DISAE Facility project LAT - 108 Preparation of the Latvian middle-term strategy for approximation of Community environmental legislation will start in August 1998. This project will analyze environmental institutions at national, regional and local levels and elaborate proposal for institutional strengthening and preparation of an action plan for institutional development.

Project to Assist Latvia in Approximation of Community Laws concerning Industrial Pollution Prevention and Control (IPPC) and Environmental Management of Industry financed by Danish Ministry of Environment & Energy and Danish Environmental Protection Agency started from March 1998 and will last for 2 years.

Joint project of MEPRD and Swedish EPA Latvian approach to Community Water Resources Directive will end in 1998. The objective of this project is to provide institutional capacity to the Latvian Ministry of Environmental Protection and Regional Development for development of National water resources framework. However the Swedish project is dealing only with Daugava River basin, therefore additional assistance is requested in the framework of Phare project.
