# 2. Objectives

#### **General Objective**

To create the necessary measures for adapting the Latvian economy to the internal market in the fields of macro economic policies, state aid, procurement, tax and customs administration and standards.

#### **Specific Objectives**

- ◆ Strengthening of the economic forecasting and planning capacity of the Ministry of Finance.
- Insure the reform of protection of competition, particular in the field of State Aid by training of State Aid Surveillance Commission and dissemination of information.
- Enhancement of the information systems and administrative procedures for government procurement.
- ♦ Increase the capacity of the State Revenue Service in planning and implementing administrative systems.
- ♦ Strengthening of the national standardisation body with regard to information systems and implementation of Community directives in conformity assessment and standardisation.
- ♦ To upgrade the data management system of the Central Statistical Bureau to conform with Eurostat requirements and internationally accepted standards and methods of production of statistical data. This upgrading will support the strengthening of the budgetary process and macro economic forecasting.

## 3. Description

### **Sub-component 1 – Macro Economic Policies**

The project will assist with the reformulation of the strategy for economic policy and preparation of a medium-term economic strategy. This will include training of staff in forecasting and planning.

## **Sub-component 2 – State Aid Control**

The project will provide training and study tours to the State Aid Surveillance Commission in the following topics: tax related state aids, control of state aid, national procedures for recovery of illegal aids, creation of a state aid inventory, Community state aid measures for promotion of innovation, special economic zones and free ports. The project will also provide organisational and institutional development support to the State Aid Surveillance Commission.

#### **Sub-component 3 – Government Procurement**

The project will provide assistance to the development of IT system for statistics (requirement of EC directives), and establishment of link to international databases. Furthermore the project will provide assistance to the drafting of secondary legislation and forms to be utilised by the procuring government and municipal entities. Strengthening of procurement audit system and complaints procedures.

#### **Sub-component 4 – Tax & Customs Administration**

The project will provide assistance to the IT Department of the State Revenue Service (Ministry of Finance) with the preparation of the detailed technical specification of an IT system. The project forms part of the preparation for an overall investment programme

for the tax & customs administration, which is also support by the World Bank.

# Sub-component 5 – Standards IT System

Assistance with the establishment of a national standardisation body including creation of an information system and a database with Community standards. Assistance with the adoption of the New approach directives including and analysis of the current situation in the area of conformity assessment and standardisation. Provision of updated information to the European Commission on progress in development of conformity assessment ad standardisation.

#### Sub-component 6 – Statistical Data Management System

To design a data management system which meets the future requirements of CSB and optimises the utilisation of the existing IT systems. This will include the implementation of data input software/hardware which harmonises data input procedures. The inputs for the project will be a complete analysis including the design documentation for the overall data management system and technical assistance. Hardware and software for the creation of the data management system. Training in the operation of the data management system. (A central data repo sitory for accumulated statistical data and associated meta data and data dissemination software/hardware system including security control to comply with data protection requirements will follow when funding has been secured from budget and other sources).

#### **Expected results and outputs**

- Reformulated and specified medium-term economic strategy to be submitted to the European Commission and enhanced skills of staff in macro economic forecasting and strategic planning.
- ♦ Enhanced capacity of the State Aid Surveillance Commission in the implementation and enforcement Community state control principles.
- ♦ Implemented information system for government procurement statistics and linkages to international databases.
- Prepared IT project for the State Revenue Service for the administration (internal audit and accounting) of tax & customs.
- ♦ Implemented legislative acts in accordance with the Acquis. Adopted Community standards according to the New Approach Directives and developed information systems and databases.
- ♦ Improved integrated statistical data processing in line with the forecast changes in European legislation standards and the development of "the information society". The design and implementation of the data management system.

#### 4. Institutional Framework

The Ministry of Finance is responsible for Macro Economic Policies, State Aid Control, and Government & Municipal Procurement. The Department for Economics Analysis and Fiscal Policy, the State and Municipal Procurement Monitoring Department and the State Surveillance Committee are responsible for the implementation of the project components in their respective areas.

The State Revenue Service is an institution under the supervision of the Ministry of Finance and responsible for tax and customs.

The Ministry of Economy is responsible for Standards and the Department of Quality Management and Structure development and the Latvian National Standardisation and Metrology Centre are responsible for the implementation of the project component relating to this area.

The Central Statistical Bureau is an independent institution under the supervision of the Ministry of Economy. The newly established IT Department of the CSB will be the main recipient and will implement for the project component relating to statistics.

# 9. Conditionality and Sequencing

- ♦ Adequate staffing in the recipient institutions has to be in place for implementation and monitoring of project components.
- ♦ The project components must be closely co-ordinated with other programmes and projects funded by budget, or bilateral sources.
- The first Latvian medium-term strategy has been produced.
- ♦ The State Aid Surveillance Commission and secretariats have recently been established. The project should therefore easily be implemented.
- ◆ National Council of Standardisation has been established and national standardisation programme has been drafted. Several New Approach directives have been accepted in the national legislation (Electromagnetic compatibility, Low voltage, and construction products).
- ♦ A precondition for a successful implementation of the project component for statistics will be that the funding will be available as planned as the technical platform is in place. The newly established IT department has almost all staff in place and is ready to implement the project.
